1007	Rush, near the sewer	Unknown	Unknown	This wreck lies at low watermark. Bourke suggests that it is the <i>Isabel</i> , lost in 1876.
1008	Edge of sand line near sewer outlet at Rush or Skerries harbour	<i>Isabel</i>	11/11/1876	A brig <i>en route</i> from Arendal to Dundalk carrying a cargo of railway sleepers. One of the crew of eight was lost with the vessel 8.
1009	Near the entrance to Rush harbour	<i>Dolly Varden</i> or <i>Dolly Vorden</i>	02/05/1900	A 25 or 30-tonne wooden yawl, owned by J. Gough of Rus; its master was R. Bashel. It was out fishing from Rush with nine crew when it was lost.
1010	Rush, 2–3 miles off	Unknown	16/05/1854	
1011	Rush Bank	<i>Margaret</i>	4/7/1824	A schooner from Leith, lost while <i>en route</i> from Glasgow to Dunmare
1012	Rush Point	Unknown	8/5/1887	A wooden yacht or yawl, lost while <i>en route</i> from Rush to Portrane.
1013	Rush Point, near	<i>Industry</i>	14/12/1886	An auxiliary schooner, built in 1849. It was lost in ESE Force 9 winds while carrying a cargo of coal from Liverpool to Arklow.
1014	Rush Point, near	<i>Nicholas</i>	16/01/1774	This Drontheim vessel sprang a leak and was lost while <i>en route</i> from Drogheda.
1015	Rush Point, off	Unknown	08/05/1887	This vessel was lost while <i>en route</i> from Rush to Portrane.
1016	Rush to Portrane	<i>James</i>	15/12/1828	This vessel sprang a leak and ran ashore while <i>en route</i> from Newport to Glasgow with a cargo of coal.

1017	One quarter mile north of Loughshinny near Rush	<i>Myrtle</i>	31/3/1853	This Campleton smack was lost in SSE force 9 winds while <i>en route</i> from Preston to Dublin.
1018	Loughshinny	Unknown	11/4/1850	Described as a large vessel wrecked at Loughshinny.
1019	Loughshinny harbour	<i>Village Belle</i>	27/02/1900	This wooden lugsail fishing vessel, was lost with one crew member.
1020	Loughshinny	Unknown	11/04/1850	A sloop lost in this location.
1021	Rogerstown	Unknown	08/10/1775	A schooner lost in this location while carrying a cargo of wheat.
1022	Rogerstown	Unknown	08/10/1775	A vessel of unknown type lost in this location with a cargo of wine.
1023	Rogerstown Bar or Donabate	<i>Queen Adelaide</i>	09/02/1861	This steamship was lost in NE force 10 winds while carrying a cargo of grain and flax.
1024	Rogerstown Bay	<i>Victoria</i>	05/01/1854	This schooner was lost while <i>en route</i> from Liverpool to Wexford, carrying stone for a tramway company.
1025	Lambay to Rush	<i>Robert</i>	03/02/1834	This steamship struck Kish Bank while <i>en route</i> from Liverpool to Savannah with a cargo of ore. Its lower deck beam was washed ashore off Clogher head.
1026	Three and a half miles north-west of Lambay	<i>Ernest</i>	17/4/1875	This Bridgewater ketch collided with the SS Meteor of Dublin while <i>en route</i> from Ardrossan to Bristol with a cargo of pig iron. It struck on the starboard side, aft of the mainmast and sank immediately. Of the five crew members, two saved themselves by climbing onboard the SS <i>Meteor</i> from the rigging of their vessel.
1027	Lambay, two miles north of Fraser Patch, north of Lambay	<i>Isabel</i>	09/01/1913	This steel steamer was lost while <i>en route</i> from Garston to Balbriggan. Of the five crew member, one was lost. A 70ft metal wreck was found in 27m of water between Rockabill and Lambay in 1991.
1028	North-west side of Lambay	<i>Shamrock</i>	21/12/1878	This Wexford schooner was lost in NW force 4 winds while <i>en route</i> from Glasgow to New Ross with a cargo of coal.
1029	Portrane rocks between Lambay and the mainland	<i>Tergiste</i>	14/11/1858	An Austrian coal brig was lost in this location.
1030	Five miles south-south-west of Skerries lighthouse	<i>Countess of Arran</i>	18/2/1854	This vessel was <i>en route</i> from Sunderland with a cargo of pig iron and coke when it sprang a leak near Skerries lighthouse.

1031	Skerries pier, one half mile southwest	<i>Ebruna</i> or <i>Eblana</i>	14/10/1881	A schooner was reported lost in a WSW gale in this location.
1032	Skerries, one mile from	<i>Juniata</i>	04/12/1825	This schooner was <i>en route</i> from Liverpool to Java with a cargo of coal. It ran ashore one mile from Skerries and was lost.
1033	Skerries, rocks near	<i>Caroline</i>	13/09/1822	This wooden yawl was <i>en route</i> from Liverpool to Bideford when lost.
1034	Skerries, three miles southwest	<i>Matthew Owen</i>	16/07/1889	This barque was <i>en route</i> from Liverpool to Rosscarbery when lost.
1035	One mile off Lambay	<i>Lancaster</i> or <i>Lancashire</i>	28/01/1910	This steel coal-boat was <i>en route</i> from Widnes to Balbriggan with a cargo of coal when lost. All six crew were saved. The ship's bell was recovered subsequently from the site.
1036	Ten miles east of Lambay	<i>Geraldine</i>	30/03/1918	A fishing smack was sunk by a submarine in this location. All five crew were lost.
1037	Twenty miles off Lambay	<i>Mary Reed</i>	February 1833	A larger brig ran down this vessel while <i>en route</i> from Dublin with a cargo of grain.
1038	Six miles east of Lambay	<i>Hypatia</i>	24/07/1904	This iron steam trawler of Hartlepool was fishing out of Dublin when lost.
1039	Between the Skerries and Kish lightship	<i>Innisfallen</i>	23/05/1918	This twin-funnelled steam vessel was <i>en route</i> from Liverpool to Cork when attacked by a submarine. It was torpedoed abreast of the boilers and sank. Eleven crew members were lost, and twenty-three were saved.
1040	c. 1 mile E of Lambay off Seal Hole	Unknown	Unknown	A slate boat was wrecked in this location. Fragments of pipe have been found buried on the seabed.
1041	Irish Sea	<i>Wavelite</i>	04/03/1908	A vessel from Maryport was lost in this location along with all of its twelve crew.
1042	Lambay Island, approx. 1.5 miles NE of 53 31 00N, 05 59 00W	<i>Nellie Esplin</i>	20/11/1924	A ketch carrying dispatches was lost in this location.
